## Crayons to Classrooms: Dayton's only free store for teachers

We serve under-funded teachers and economically disadvantaged students in Dayton-area schools

**Crayons to Classrooms is a nonprofit teacher resource center** that helps under-funded teachers from low-income schools in the Dayton region obtain free school supplies for their economically disadvantaged students. Supplies are provided at no cost to teachers, families or schools.

Crayons to Classrooms believes no child should go to school without the basic supplies needed for learning. We also believe if teachers and students have the tools to succeed – they will.

#### **Students participate in the National School Lunch Program**

Ultimately, our goal is to serve all high-need, K-12 schools in the Dayton region – those with 70 percent or more students participating in the National School Lunch Program. Because these students live in poverty, basic school supplies are a luxury. If parents are struggling to provide food for their children, they are unable to buy notebooks, pens and other supplies essential for academic achievement.

In 2010, there were 88 high-need, K-12 schools in the Dayton region, with 26,500 students participating in the National School Lunch program. Currently, however, Crayons to Classrooms has the resources to serve only those schools with the greatest need.

**As we work toward our goal, our objective is steady, careful growth** to ensure we continue to provide the best possible shopping experiences and supplies for teachers. Based on trends, the number of high-need, K-12 schools will continue to increase.

#### **School supplies come from many sources**

Crayons to Classrooms stocks the free store for teachers by collecting donations of new, surplus, closeout or other available school supplies. We provide some schools with pre-assembled school box kits, paid for by individuals and companies that want to sponsor a classroom, grade, school or multiple schools.

As an affiliate of the Kids in Need National Network of Resource Centers, Crayons to Classrooms also receives school supplies donated to the Kids in Need Foundation by manufacturers and retailers. Crayons to Classrooms was invited to become part of this exclusive network because of our stability and efficiency, among other criteria.

## Teachers can shop for free at least twice a year

Eligible teachers can shop on designated days at our clean, well-organized, retail-style free store. Available are:

- Basic supplies
- Incentives such as stickers, erasers, calendars, highlighters and other prizes to motivate individual students or entire classrooms
- Specialty items for science fairs, art competitions and classroom-wide projects
- Coats and personal care items

Crayons to Classrooms invites teachers to shop because studies show they spend \$500 to \$1,000 of their own money each year to purchase school supplies for their needlest students.

- The 1,760 teachers in our region's 88 high-need, K-12 schools in 2010 spent at least \$880,000 that year.
- Crayons to Classrooms helps to alleviate this ever-increasing burden on our teachers.


